With a 2015 Presidential Memorandum on Mitigating Impacts on Natural Resources from development, the Obama Administration has ushered in a new era of compensatory mitigation. The Presidential Memo requires federal agencies – including the Departments of Defense, the Interior, and Agriculture; the Environmental Protection Agency; and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration; and all bureaus or agencies within them – to adopt mitigation policies that implement certain federal principles aimed at landscape-scale conservation mitigation.

They further note that "the principles to be implemented share some similarities with the mitigation framework used by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Clean Water Act section 404 permitting to mitigate for impacts to wetlands and streams."

The presenter at the webinar will be Kerry L. McGrath of Hunton & Williams LLP. Ms. McGrath will address "the new approach to mitigation for impacts to natural resources and the implications for agriculture." She will also address "different compensation sources and trends in mitigation/conservation banking.
