As Outside Counsel and Claims Administrator for the Nebraska Excess Liability Fund, Laura is responsible for tracking claims against qualified health care providers and settling claims that reach into the Fund's layer of coverage. She collaborates with actuaries and Department counsel on the Fund's annual surcharge determinations, reports, and reinsurance renewals. This hands-on experience gives Laura a practical understanding of the insurance business, risk management, and the complexities facing insurers today.
