On-Site Civil Inspection Procedures: U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Final Rule

The United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") issued a final rule on March 2nd that is intended to provide direction to its personnel on how to conduct on-site civil administrative inspections. See 84 Fed. Reg. 12224.

The final rule cites Section 7 of White House Executive Order 13892 which is entitled:

Ensuring Reasonable Administrative Inspections

The Executive Order states:

Within 120 days of the date of this order, each agency that conducts civil administrative inspections shall publish a rule of agency procedure governing such inspections, if such a rule does not already exist. Once published, an agency must conduct inspections of regulated parties in compliance with the rule.

EPA's rulemaking addresses the common elements applicable to on-site civil inspections for compliance with all environmental laws that EPA implements.

Statutory authority cited for this procedural rule includes language from the following:

- Clean Air Act
- Clean Water Act
- Superfund
- Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act
- Resource Conservation and Recovery Act
- Safe Drinking Water Act
- Toxic Substances Control Act

The rule addresses issues such as:

- Timing of inspections and facility notification
- Inspector qualifications
- Obtaining consent to enter
- Opening conference
- Physical inspection
- Managing confidential business information
- Interview facility personnel
- Records review
- Sampling

- Closing conference
- Inspection report

Arkansas has been delegated almost every federal environmental statutory and regulatory provision.
