## Electric Vehicle Charging Stations: Arkansas Department of Energy and Environment - Division of Environmental Quality Announces Rebate Recipients

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The Arkansas Department of Energy and Environment – Division of Environmental Quality ("DEQ") announced in a June 2nd news release the "First Rebate Recipients of Level 2 Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment Program."

The program is administered by DEQ's Energy Office.

Level 2 stations are those that can charge electric vehicles ("EVs") in eight hours or less using a 250-volt output.

EVs currently account for approximately two percent of the American vehicle market. However, Arkansas is among a number of states that are attempting to spur the construction of EV charging infrastructure. Such charging infrastructure is being targeted in various states for personal, commercial, fleet and public transit use.

The cost of installing charging infrastructure is a potential barrier to the expansion of EVs into the marketplace.

DEQ's Level 2 Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment program provided rebates for the installation of Level 2 electric vehicle charging stations. It is open to both public and private applicants across the state.
