Pretreatment Enforcement/Clean Water Act: Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality and Ripley Sorbent Product Manufacturer Enter into Agreed Order

The Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality ("MCEQ") and Oil Dri Production Company ("ODPC") entered into an October 21st Agreed Order ("AO") addressing alleged violations of a Clean Water Act Pretreatment Permit. See Order No. 7576 25.

The AO provides that ODPC holds a State Operating Pretreatment Permit for its facility in Ripley, Mississippi.

The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality is stated to have conducted a Compliance Evaluation Inspection at the facility on May 8th.

ODPC was subsequently notified of the following alleged violations:

- Conducted and reported sampling results for days the facility had no discharge in violations of Condition T-17.
- Failed to report a discharge for months in which a discharge had occurred in violation of Condition S2.
- Failed to meet sampling and temperature requirements in violations of Condition T-21.
- Failed to maintain all sample monitoring results for the month of September 2023, in violation of Condition R-1.

ODPC is stated to have provide a letter on June 3rd acknowledging it understood the requirements of the Pretreatment Permit and asserted the violations will not occur in the future.

The AO assesses a civil penalty of \$26,300.00.
