25	SECTION 1. A	rkansas Code Title 8, Chapter 6, Subchapte	r 10, is amended
26	to add an additiona	l section to read as follows:

4	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
5	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that improperly managed solid waste		
6	at landfills poses a danger to the citizens of this state; that it is		
7	imperative that the Landfill Post-Closure Trust Fund remain at an adequate		
8	level to sufficiently address issues related to solid waste at landfills that		
9	pose a hazard to public health and endanger the environment; and that this		
10	act is immediately necessary because full reimbursement of the fund should		
11	occur and safeguards put in place for landfills that have previously posed		
12	environmental risks and needed state funding for corrective action in order		
13	to protect the health and wellbeing of citizens. Therefore, an emergency is		
14	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the		
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
16	on:		
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
20	bill; or		
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
