It is found and determined by the 35 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the state has a critical 36 interest in ensuring the efficient provision of services by state agencies;

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1	that state agencies operate on a fiscal year calendar; and that the
2	effectiveness of this act on July 1, 2023, is essential to the efficient
3	operation of the state agencies subject to this act; and that, in the event
4	of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in effective date of
5	this act beyond July 1, 2023, could cause irreparable harm upon the proper
6	administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,
7	an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the
8	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
