REQUEST FOR ADJUDICATORY HEARING AND COMMISSION REVIEW

- 1. Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. 8-4-205(B)(1) and (2) and APCEC Regulation No. 8.601 and 8.603, the following individuals, by their attorney, Richard H. Mays of Richard Mays Law Firm, PLLC, hereby requests an adjudicatory hearing and the opportunity to present evidence and oral argument before the Arkansas Commission on Pollution Control and Ecology (the "Commission") regarding the decision of the Director of the Arkansas Department of Energy and Environment, Division of Environmental Quality (herein, "DEQ") (or the Director's delegated officer) dated March 17, 2023, to grant and issue Permit No. 0290-S4-R2 ("the Permit"), for the expansion of the Eco-Vista Landfill ("the Landfill) in or near the City of Tontitown, Washington County, Arkansas, for the reasons enumerated below (the "Appeal").
- 2. The parties who join in this Petition (herein, "the Petitioners") are those named in the attached Addendum.
- 3. Each of the Petitioners on behalf of whom this Request is filed submitted comments to DEQ during the authorized comment period established by DEQ for submission of official comments on the draft permit as required for standing to file this Request pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. 8-4-205(B)(1) and (2) and APCEC Regulation No. 8.601 and 8.603. Each such comments

addressed some, if not all, of the legal issues and factual objections being appealed as required by said statute and Regulations.

4. Pursuant to Commission Regulation 8.603(B)(1), this Request has been filed on behalf of the persons named in the Addendum within thirty (30) days of the date of the permitting decision made by the Director (or his delegated officer), which was March 17, 2023.

General Background

- 5. Eco-Vista Landfill, LLC ("EVL") owns and operates a large Landfill on some 609 acres of land in Washington County, Arkansas, near the incorporated town of Tontitown. Within that Landfill, there exists an active Class 1 landfill, a closed Class 1 landfill, an active Class 4 landfill, a closed Class 4 landfill, a composting facility, and various support facilities including a landfill office, entrance/scale facilities, vehicle/equipment maintenance facilities, borrow areas, surface water management systems, and other waste processes and equipment.
- 6. The active Class 4 landfill is the operation for which a renewal permit for expansion of the Landfill was issued by DEQ on March 17, 2023, under NPDES Permit No. 0290-S-R2. It is this renewal permit for which this Petition for Adjudicatory Hearing and Commission Review is sought.
- 7. The Class 4 landfill was initially permitted on April 16, 1997 in a proceeding in which, after public notice of the filing of the application by the then-owner, Sunray, for authority to construct and operate the landfill, no comments were submitted by the public. At that time, the landfill was in a sparsely populated area, and few people were affected by it.
- 8. In the intervening years since 1997, northwest Arkansas (including Washington and Benton Counties) have seen and continue to experience some of the most explosive growth of any area in the United States. As population in those two counties has rapidly and steadily

expanded, the landfill is now located in an increasingly populated area, with numerous residences surrounding the general landfill area. That growth is projected to continue without abatement for years to come.

- 9. During the intervening years from 1997 to the present, the landfill has also expanded rapidly as waste products from the increasing population and construction have made significant demands upon the landfill and its capacity to handle additional wastes. In addition, the record on DEQ's website clearly establishes that the landfill has experienced significant and troubling problems in managing and containing the emission of air and water pollutants from the facility, creating conditions that are physically and mentally unbearable and potentially harmful to the health and safety of persons who live in the general proximity of the landfill, and to birds and other animals in the vicinity, and to trees and other vegetation.
- 10. Based upon the records of DEQ relative to this Class 4 landfill and the Class 1 landfill in the EVL complex, the landfill has reached its capacity, or is very close to doing so. That capacity is the cause of many complaints from the public and also from DEQ as evidenced by the inspection reports that appear in the record.
- 11. This Appeal is taken from the Permit Decision of the Director based upon the issues more particularly described below. Petitioners request an adjudicatory hearing and Commission review with respect to the Permit Decision, as more particularly described in the specific issues enumerated below and based upon the process contained in Commission Regulation 8.
- 12. Petitioners request that the Commission find that: (i) the Permit Decision is contrary to the Commission's rules and its governing statutory authority; (ii) that DEQ has failed to provide an adequate written explanation of the rationale for the Permit Decision; that DEQ has failed to demonstrate that the Permit Decision was based upon generally accepted scientific knowledge

and engineering practices; and that DEQ has failed to address the issues raised and established by the Petitioners during the Comment period, all as required by Regulation No. 8, Section 8.211(A)(2).

Factual and Legal Matters Applicable to All Issues

- 1. DEQ Was Not Authorized by Law to Process EVL's Application for Increased Landfill Acreage
- 13. Commission Rule 22.204 (a) (Host Community Approval of Site Selection) provides in relevant part as follows:
 - (a) Applicability and Scope In accordance with A.C.A. §8-6-1501 et seq., a rebuttable presumption exists against permitting the construction or operation of any new landfill within twelve miles of an existing high-impact solid waste facility. [Here follows certain exceptions not relevant to this matter]
- 14. A "high-impact solid waste management facility" is defined in Rule 22.204(b)(1) as "any open or closed solid waste landfill. EVL is a "high-impact solid waste management facility.

Rule 22.204(c) (Division Action and Compliance Requirements) further provides:

The Division shall not process any pre-application for a new or increased landfill acreage or an application for increased landfill capacity until definitive findings in conformance with this section have been provided by the host community and accepted by the Division. Acceptance or denial of landfill siting by the host community shall be by formal resolution of the governing body of the host community.

15. The "host community" in regard to EVL is the City of Tontitown, Washington County, Arkansas. The governing body of the City of Tontitown has not officially approved EVL's proposed increased landfill acreage or an application for increased landfill capacity. The resolution by the City of Tontitown in July 2018 referred to in Sec. 2.0 of EVL's Application is not an unconditional approval of the proposed expansion, and the 2020 Ordinance rezoning approximately 417.1 acres of EVL property to an exclusive use-landfill zoning classification is

also not an unconditional approval of the proposed expansion. The City of Tontitown has not provided a definitive acceptance of the proposed expansion by formal resolution in satisfaction of Rule 22.204(c).

2. The Certificate Of Need Supporting EVL's Application For Expansion Was Not Valid

16. In EVL's Application for Permit Modification of the Class 4 Landfill, it is stated in relevant part in Section 2.1 (Certificate of Need for Landfills and Transfer Stations (§22.305)):

A notice of intent (NOI) to apply for a CON [Certificate of Need] was submitted to the Boston Mountain Solid Waste District on January 22, 2018. The CON petition was submitted to the district on March 16, 2018, and a public hearing was held on April 18, 2018. The CON was approved by the district on May 10, 2018 (DIN 73979). The rules and regulations of the district require the submittal a [sic] permit application for a solid waste landfill permit to DEQ within 6 month of receipt of a CON. In August 2018, the district issued an extension on this timeline until July 6, 2020. In May, 2020, a second extension was granted by the district until July 6, 2021. Additionally, in May 2021, Eco-Vista submitted a request to the district regarding alternative designs or equivalencies as allowed by Regulation No. 22. The district approved the request from Eco-Vista. The NOI, CON petition, and district letters are included in Appendix D.

17. It should be noted that the original application for a CON was made by EVL in January 2018, and the CON was issued by the Boston Mountain Waste Management District ("the District") on May 10, 2018. The Application for the modification of the permit in question was not submitted by the consultant for EVL until July 7, 2021, more than three years after the CON was issued to EVL by the District.

18. As EVL acknowledged in its Application (p. 2-2), the District's regulations require that the CON be submitted with a permit application to DEQ within *six* (6) months after the CON is issued. One reason for this requirement is that conditions relative to landfills that affect permitting change relatively rapidly. Consequently, there are no provisions in the District's regulation that authorize an extension of the six (6) month deadline for submission of the CON to

DEQ with an application for a permit. Yet, EVL's Application for Permit – filed July 7, 2021—acknowledges that two extensions of the CON were issued to EVL by the District increasing the effective date to July 6, 2021 – the <u>day before</u> the Application was received at DEQ, according to DEQ's digital stamp. Even assuming the CON was otherwise valid, it was not received by DEQ within the time for which it was valid based upon the District's extension of the CON to July 6, 2021. All of the extensions were unauthorized and in excess of the authority of the District to issue as extensions were not authorized by the District's regulations nor Commission Regulation 22.

- 19. Without waiving any of the foregoing objections, to the extent that the City of Tontitown did issue any approval, or what might be deemed an approval of EVL's Application for expansion of the Class 4 landfill, that approval was withdrawn prior to a decision having been made, and during the official public comment period on the draft permit. That withdrawal of approval was in the form of Resolution No. 2022-11-1017R, dated November 3, 2022, a copy of which was submitted to DEQ. A second Resolution of similar import, Resolution No. 2023-01-1027R, was also adopted by the City of Tontitown on January 3, 2023, and also provided to DEQ. A copy of Resolution No. 2022-11-1017R is attached to this Request as **Exhibit No. 1**, and a copy of Resolution No. 2023-01-1027R is attached to this Request as **Exhibit No. 2**.
- 20. Furthermore, EVL's Permit Application also states in Section 2.1, p. 2-2, regarding the CON, that:

Additionally, in May, 2021, Evo-Vista submitted a request to the district regarding *alternative designs or equivalencies* as allowed by Regulation 22. The district approved the request from ECO-Vista. (Italics added)

21. EVL's request to the District regarding alternative designs or equivalencies are substantial modifications to the scope of the CON, and no public notice or opportunity to submit

comments on those designs or equivalencies was issued by EVL or the District. The District's approval of the CON was therefore void.

- 3. The Certificate of Need Issued by The Waste Management District Was A Result of a Directive by the Department.
- 22. On January 22, 2018, a letter was issued to Ms. Annette Cusher of DEQ from Carl Simmons, Senior District Manager of EVL and David Conrad, Engineering Manager of EVL, advising DEQ that EVL was in the process of obtaining a CON from the District for the proposed modification of the Class 4 EVL landfill in Tontitown. The letter further states that the District rules require that any applicant for a CON obtain "confirmation from ADEQ that the applicant has requested a statement concerning the current and proposed solid waste landfill disposal capacity respective to the area and landfill class being proposed," citing Section 7.01(f) of the District Rules.
- 23. In the January 22, 2018 letter, EVL requested that DEQ issue a statement "addressing this disposal capacity issue." EVL then inserted the following paragraph in that letter:

To assist you in your statement, the Eco-Vista Landfill facility in Tontitown is the only permitted Class 4 Landfill available within the District and northwest Arkansas. As of January 1, 2018, the Eco-Vista Class 4 Landfill has a total remaining permitted capacity of approximately 955,000 cubic yards. At the current fill rate, this capacity will provide the District with approximately 8 years of capacity. Therefore, Eco-Vista Landfill believes that the District is facing a complete lack of construction and demolition debris disposal capacity without a modification of the Eco-Vista facility. (Italics Supplied)

- 24. A copy of the January 22, 2018 letter from EVL to DEQ is attached to this Request as **Exhibit No. 3.**
- 25. On February 7, 2018, DEQ, writing through Maria Matoska, Permit Engineer assigned to the EVL Class 4 landfill permit, issued a letter to Robyn Reed, Director of the District. The letter first quoted the District Rule 7.01(f) (cited in the EVL letter to DEQ above), and then stated:

The Eco-Vista Landfill facility in Tontitown is the only permitted Class 4 Landfill available within the District and northwest Arkansas. As of January 1, 2018, the Eco-Vista Class 4 Landfill has a total remaining permitted capacity of approximately 955,000 cubic yards. At the current fill rate, this capacity will provide the District with approximately 8 years of capacity. Therefore, Eco-Vista Landfill believes that the District is facing a complete lack of construction and demolition debris disposal capacity without a modification of the Eco-Vista facility.

- 26. The DEQ letter of February 7, 2018 to the District is attached to this Request for Hearing as Exhibit No. 4.
- 27. The paragraph quoted above is a *verbatim* copy of the paragraph that was contained in the EVL letter to DEQ "to assist" [DEQ]" in preparing its statement to the District. Instead of submitting a simple statement to the effect that "DEQ has requested that EVL apply for a CON from the District," the letter from DEQ is an advocacy piece on behalf of EVL that is a <u>directive</u> to the District to issue the CON. The CON should be voided, and the draft Permit that is based upon the CON should likewise be voided.

4. The Proposed Permit Does Not Address Issues Raised by the Petitioners' Comments

- 28. The comments submitted by the Petitioners herein addressed the following issues (in no order of priority):
 - (a) Air contamination in the form of putrescent odors/fumes from the landfill;
 - (b) Air contamination in the form of sickening odors/fumes from chemicals used at the landfill causing respiratory distress, headaches and other health problems, death to birds in the landfill and surrounding areas, and to trees and other vegetation;
 - (c) Contamination of surface waters from leakage of the landfill;
 - (d) Spread of debris from the landfill to adjoining properties;
 - (e) Consistent tracking of mud and dirt from the landfill onto the adjoining roads;
 - (f) Spillage of nails and other objects onto the highways that cause flat tires, cracked windshields and other vehicular damage;

- (g) Increase in vectors at the landfill and the adjoining areas;
- 29. These problems have been existent for many years, and the Petitioners and other members of the public who reside in the general vicinity of the Landfill have complained to EVL and to DEQ during that time, often without any result. The problems are, to a degree, operational, but they are also systemic and worthy of being addressed in the permit renewal process.
- 30. The proposed Permit does not do so. The only portion of the Final Permit that comes close to mentioning these problems is on page 3 of 10 of the Permit, in a lengthy paragraph relating to the type of waste materials that may be disposed of in the Landfill as extended by the Permit. It states that only bulky inert, non-putrescible Class 4 solid waste, such as non-compostable wood wastes (tree trunks, stumps, demolition and construction debris, shredded or processed tires, and furniture) may be disposed of in the landfill. "Hazardous and/or toxic waste materials, liquid or semi-liquid wastes, household wastes of any kind, putrescible waste, paper wastes" are not authorized for disposal.
- 31. These are essentially the same wastes that were authorized or not authorized for disposal in the Landfill under previous Class 4 permits. However, the problems that have existed with the Landfill indicate that materials other than inert, non-putrescible Class 4 solid waste have been deposited in the Landfill, and are reacting through contact with other wastes, water and decay to cause noxious odors, gasses, and debris to emanate from the Landfill.
- 32. Pursuant to Commission Regulation 8.211, which authorizes the Director to impose special conditions upon the issuance of a permit, the Permit should be used as a vehicle to

address the long-standing and well-known problems described above by requiring EVL to take additional measures to ensure that:

- (i) the materials placed in the proposed extension are only those within the Class4 wastes;
- (ii) wastes placed in the Landfill remain there (not blown out);
- (iii) adequate cover is placed on the wastes at a more frequent interval than once a week;
- (iv) vehicles leaving the Landfill do not track mud and other dirt materials onto the roads and highways in the area; and
- (v) reduce or eliminate the presence of vectors at and around the Landfill.
- 33. Regarding the long-standing and well-known odor/gas problems, the Permit should also require EVL to:
 - a. conduct a study by a qualified independent contractor of the cause of the odors that are being released from the existing Landfill;
 - b. propose a plan to DEQ to remediate the existing Landfill to prevent the continued release of odors, with the Petitioners allowed to comment on the Plan;
 - c. implement the remediation plan approved by DEQ and Petitioners.
- 34. Under Arkansas Code § 8-4-205(c)(6)(B) and APC&EC Regulation 8.612(A)(2), the issuance of the Permit at issue is automatically stayed. However, in a letter of March 28, 2023, Promus Engineering, a contractor of EVL, notified Ms. Annette Cusher, P.C., of DEQ of a construction schedule for construction of Cell 8A at the Eco-Vista Class 4 Landfill. In that letter, Promus gave notice that it proposed to commence construction on a 5.5 acre compacted clay

bottom liner and leachate collection system for Cell 8A on April 1, 2023, and complete the construction in approximately July 2023. A copy of the Promus letter to DEQ dated March 28, 2023, is attached to this Request as **Exhibit No. 5.**

- 35. EVL should be ordered to cease or refrain from any activities, such as construction, on implementing the Final Permit until final review of the Permit is obtained.
- 36. A copy of the Request for Hearing is being served on all appropriate parties identified in Regulation 8.603(C)(1)(a)-(e).



WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council is aware that such problems and issues related to the Landfill operation which have occurred with regularity over the course of the past number of years include, but are not limited to, loud noises, debris, serious air quality concerns including noxious gases and odors, pollutants in the ground, water quality issues and other issues; and

WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council is aware that growth in the region and the city is robust and more people will be negatively impacted by increased Landfill operations; and

WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council acknowledges that the city has become administratively burdened through the receipt of continuous complaints regarding Landfill operations; and

WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council acknowledges that a municipality has a significantly limited role in the regulation of Landfill operations, but believes it is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Tontitown by affirming to regulatory authorities that the Tontitown City Council, to the extent possible, desires to express its belief that the approval of the expansion of the Landfill will be detrimental to the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the final decision for the expansion of the Landfill has not been made; and

WHEREAS, after thorough consideration of the above, the City Council has determined that the location of the Landfill expansion gives rise to concern for potential limitations to the City's opportunity for growth and desires to withdraw their support of the Landfill expansion in order to protect the best interest and benefit of the citizens of Tontitown.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Tontitown, Arkansas:

Section 1. It is hereby the express desire of the Tontitown City Council, for the reasons set forth above and to the extent possible, that the final approval of the Landfill expansion be denied, or in the alternative delayed until such issues which are negatively affecting the health, safety and welfare of the community can be investigated and addressed by the appropriate regulatory authorities.

Section 2. The Mayor or her designee is hereby authorized to bring this Resolution to the attention of the regulatory authorities and to provide information to such regulatory authorities as is requested or necessary.

WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council is aware that such problems and issues related to the Landfill operation which have occurred with regularity over the course of the past number of years include, but are not limited to, loud noises, debris, serious air quality concerns including noxious gases and odors, pollutants in the ground, water quality issues and other issues; and

WHEREAS, these problems and issues have been communicated to proper regulatory authorities and Eco-Vista by citizens and others, but to date have not been mitigated or addressed; and



WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council is aware that growth in the region and the city is robust and more people will be negatively impacted by increased Landfill operations; and

WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council acknowledges that the city has become administratively burdened through the receipt of continuous complaints regarding Landfill operations; and

WHEREAS, the Tontitown City Council acknowledges that a municipality has a significantly limited role in the regulation of Landfill operations, but believes it is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Tontitown by affirming to regulatory authorities that the Tontitown City Council, to the extent possible, desires to express its belief that the approval of the expansion of the Landfill will be detrimental to the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the final decision for the expansion of the Landfill has not been made; and

WHEREAS, after thorough consideration of the above, the City Council has determined that the location of the Landfill expansion gives rise to concern for potential limitations to the City's opportunity for growth and desires to withdraw their support of the Landfill expansion in order to protect the best interest and benefit of the citizens of Tontitown.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Tontitown, Arkansas:

<u>Section 1.</u> It is hereby the express desire of the Tontitown City Council, for the reasons set forth above and to the extent possible, that the final approval of the Landfill expansion be denied.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Mayor or her designee is hereby authorized to bring this Resolution to the attention of the regulatory authorities and to provide information to such regulatory authorities as is requested or necessary.


