AN ACT

To direct the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to establish a stormwater infrastructure funding task force, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Innovative Stormwater
3	Infrastructure Act of 2018".
4	SEC. 2. STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING TASK
5	FORCE.
6	(a) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the
7	date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the
8	Environmental Protection Agency shall establish a
9	stormwater infrastructure funding task force composed of
10	representatives of Federal, State, and local governments
11	and private (including nonprofit) entities to conduct a
12	study on, and develop recommendations to improve, the
13	availability of public and private sources of funding for
14	the construction, rehabilitation, and operation and mainte-
15	nance of stormwater infrastructure to meet the require-
16	ments of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33
17	U.S.C. 1251 et seq.).
18	(b) Considerations.—In carrying out subsection
19	(a), the task force shall—
20	(1) identify existing Federal, State, and local
21	public sources and private sources of funding for
22	stormwater infrastructure; and
23	(2) consider—
24	(A) how funding for stormwater infrastruc-
25	ture from such sources has been made avail-
26	able, and utilized, in each State to address

- stormwater infrastructure needs identified pursuant to section 516(b)(1) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1375(b)(1));
 - (B) how the source of funding affects the affordability of the infrastructure (as determined based on the considerations used to assess the financial capability of municipalities under the integrated planning guidelines described in the Integrated Municipal Stormwater and Wastewater Planning Approach Framework, issued by the Environmental Protection Agency on June 5, 2012, and dated May, 2012), including consideration of the costs associated with financing the infrastructure; and
 - (C) whether such sources of funding are sufficient to support capital expenditures and long-term operation and maintenance costs necessary to meet the stormwater infrastructure needs of municipalities.
- 20 (c) Report.—Not later than 18 months after the 21 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall sub-22 mit to Congress a report that describes the results of the 23 study conducted, and the recommendations developed, 24 under subsection (a).

- 1 (d) STATE DEFINED.—In this section, the term
- 2 "State" has the meaning given that term in section 502
- 3 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C.
- 4 1362).
