In celebration of the 21st annual War Eagle Appreciation Day, the Beaver Watershed Alliance was proud to present the 2025 War Eagle Creek Stewardship Award to Josh and Claliegth Tuberville, in recognition of their outstanding contributions to conservation, sustainable agriculture, and protection of the War Eagle watershed.

The Tubervilles operate a grass-fed beef farm along Holman Creek, a tributary of War Eagle Creek, where they have implemented a wide range of practices that serve as a model for responsible land and water stewardship. From rotational grazing systems and riparian protection zones to native plantings and rain gardens, their efforts reflect a deep commitment to ecological balance and agricultural sustainability—practices that support water quality protection and healthy ecosystems throughout the watershed.

Presented annually during War Eagle Appreciation Day in Madison County, the War Eagle Creek Stewardship Award celebrates landowners who demonstrate exceptional leadership in watershed conservation. This year's event, held on June 7 at OAR Kayak & Campground in Huntsville, featured music, food, and environmental activities that highlighted the importance of community-driven stewardship. The Tuberville family's dedication serves as an inspiring example of how landowners can make a lasting impact on the health of our shared water resources.
